



## CALIFORNIA VALLEY SOLAR RANCH VISUAL SCREENING PROGRAM

In September, SunPower began construction on the California Valley Solar Ranch (CVSR) Project. This 250 megawatt solar farm is located south of Highway 58, 4 miles east of Soda Lake Road and immediately north of the California Valley subdivision.

SunPower is offering a one-time planting of trees, shrubs, fencing, or a combination to screen the view of the project from residences that:

- Were occupied as of April 19, 2011;
- Are located within 1 mile of the CVSR Project or the area bounded by Highway 58, Soda Lake Road, and Seven Mile Road (whichever is greater); and
- Are not blocked from view of the CVSR Project by topography or existing obstructions.

Letters regarding this program were sent to eligible property owners in October 2011. Property owners can elect to participate in the program by completing and returning the form mailed to them (return address and envelope provided in mailing). Approximately 6 months prior to completion of the final phase of CVSR Project, a second letter will be sent to residents who did not respond to the October 2011 letter.

Eligible property owners may elect to participate in the visual screening program at any time during construction period, up until 30 days after the installation of the last solar panel by mailing the enrollment form.



A designated landscaping contractor will be responsible for the initial planting or installation of screening. Subsequent maintenance of the screening features will be the responsibility of the property owner.
